Remote Education Policy

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1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 The Ted Wragg Trust is committed to providing high-quality remote education in cases where it is not possible, or contrary to government guidance, for some or all pupils to attend school.
- 1.2 Remote education will only ever be considered as a last resort where a decision has already been made that attendance at school is not possible, but pupils are able to continue learning.

2.0 Definition

- 2.1 For the purpose of this document, The Ted Wragg Multi Academy Trust is referred to as **the Ted Wragg Trust or TWT** or **the Trust**.

3.0 Policy Statement – Remote Learning

- 3.1 During the Covid lockdown, schools within the Ted Wragg Trust used online learning to ensure that our students could continue with their curriculum via remote learning. To do this we use ClassCharts, TEAMS, Sparx, Oak Academy and online revision sites.
- 3.2 Although we no longer offer remote learning as the government require students to attend school in person, we are prepared should there be any additional school closures.
- 3.3 As outlined in the suspension and permanent exclusion guidance, headteachers should take steps to ensure work is set and marked for pupils during the first 5 school days of a suspension or permanent exclusion.
- 3.4 Where pupils eligible for benefits-related free school meals are receiving remote education, we will work with our school catering team or caterer either to provide good quality lunch parcels or to issue a food voucher if available.
