


# Christmas Carol Service





A standout feature of the production was the beautiful snowy Victorian London back-drop, the

Dickensian dry humour and the players' own inventive musical harmonies. The actors wove in rich vocal arrangements that enhanced key scenes, from festive cheer in Fezziwig's warehouse to the haunting atmosphere surrounding the Ghost of Christmas Yet to Come. These musical interludes added warmth, emotional resonance and a memorable theatrical flair.

Overall, the Quantum Group offered students an accessible and dynamic interpretation of 'A Christmas Carol', deepening their understanding of the text while showcasing the timeless power of Dickens' message about compassion, community and change.


